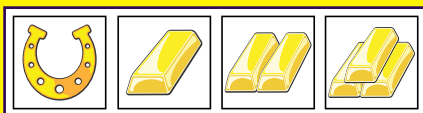

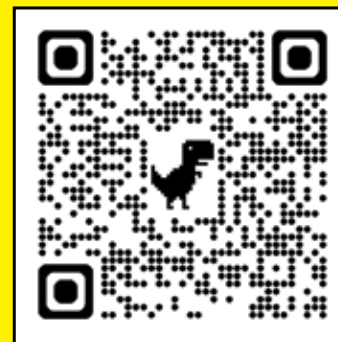

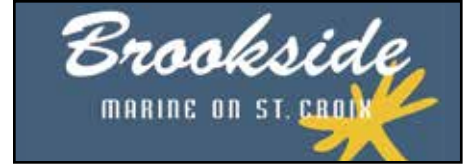

DID YOU KNOW? TIME OUTDOORS

Increasing time spent outdoors enjoying nature can positively affect mood and mental health. Generally speaking, outdoor enthusiasts tend to be happier overall. The American Psychological Association says spending time in nature is linked to both cognitive benefits and improvements in mood, mental health and emotional well-being. Both green spaces and blue (aquatic) spaces benefit overall well-being. Several years ago, the University of Derby in the United Kingdom conducted a study titled, "The 30 Days Wild." The study encouraged people to do something wild once a day for 30 days. Participants shared that their connection to nature and doing things in nature created a significant increase in happiness and health. People who spend more time outside can experience greater self-esteem, less stress, increased memory retention, and more positive body image. Natural environments also lower activity in the rumination area of the brain, decreasing negative, repetitive thoughts. Also, those who are outside more tend to be engaging in physical activities, and exercise directly correlates to better mental health.

ALL EYES ON THE MOON: UNDERSTANDING THE ARTEMIS PROGRAM

Wednesday, April 1, 2026, may have been April Fool's Day, but there was no fooling around when NASA's Artemis II mission launched into space at 6:25 p.m. EDT from Kennedy Space Center in Florida.

As many people's eyes were on the sky or watching their televisions and tablets, this flight marked the first time a manned U.S. craft had been sent toward the moon since Apollo 17 in 1972. While Artemis II was not a space shuttle (it used the Orion capsule for crew transport) the mission generated a great deal of excitement surrounding space exploration.

The crew aboard the Artemis II mission, which included three American astronauts, Reid Wiseman, Victor Glover and Christina Koch, as well as Canadian Space Agency astronaut Jeremy Hansen, didn't land on the moon; the excursion was a 10-day journey around the moon and back. It followed the Artemis I mission in 2022, which tested the Orion spacecraft and the SLS rocket. However, the goal of the Artemis program in general is a gradual step toward long-term return to the moon and future missions to Mars, according to NASA. Under Artemis, astronauts will go on increasingly difficult missions to explore more of the moon for scientific purposes and economic benefits. There's also the prize of the U.S. sending the first crewed mission to Mars in the future.

Those who were excited to witness this history-making event back in April should be pleased to learn this is only the beginning. NASA has plans to keep the Artemis momentum running in the years ahead. Artemis III (2027) will be designed to test commercial lunar landers and put astronauts back on the moon. There are plans to send two Artemis missions to the moon in 2028 to continue to build a sustainable presence and develop moon infrastructure for permanent lunar exploration. Subsequent missions will be planned roughly once per year.

Space exploration is once again exciting the general public, with the Artemis program making headway to consistent exploration beyond the Earth's atmosphere.

SPICE UP DINNERTIME WITH A CAJUN CLASSIC

Experimenting in the kitchen is one of the joys of cooking. Trying new recipes or even going off-script and tinkering with an existing recipe based on your own hunch can open eyes and treat taste buds to new flavor profiles.

Home cooks who want to expand their culinary repertoires with some particularly notable flavor can look to Cajun food and its distinct dishes to accomplish that goal. If that sounds like an exciting night in the kitchen, try this recipe from Lines+Angles.

Jambalaya With Sausage and Shrimp. Makes 4 servings

1	tablespoon vegetable oil	1	small red bell pepper, rinsed; trimmed, seeded, and diced	1	teaspoon fresh thyme leaves, minced
8	ounces chorizo or andouille sausage, sliced into 1/4-inch rounds	1	small green bell pepper, rinsed, trimmed, seeded, and diced	14	ounces canned diced tomatoes, drained, juice reserved
1	lb. large raw shell-on shrimp	4	cloves of garlic, peeled and minced	4	cups clam juice
1	onion, peeled and finely chopped	1 1/2	cups long grain white rice, rinsed	1	bay leaf
1	rib of celery, rinsed, trimmed and finely chopped	2	tablespoons tomato paste		Fresh parsley, rinsed and chopped (for garnish)
1	teaspoon salt				

1. Preheat oven to 325 F. Adjust oven rack to middle position.

2. In a deep cast iron skillet or Dutch oven, set over medium-high heat, heat oil until shimmering, but not smoking. Add sausage and cook for 3 to 5 minutes, or until browned. Remove sausage from pan using a slotted spoon and drain on paper towels. Add shrimp to the pan and cook until the shells are browned on both sides, about 1 minute per side. Transfer shrimp to a large bowl and refrigerate.

3. Add onion, celery, peppers, and garlic to the pan. Reduce heat to medium, and cook, stirring frequently, until vegetables have softened, about 7 to 10 minutes. Add rice, tomato paste, salt, and thyme; cook until rice is completely coated with oil, about 2 minutes.

4. Stir in the tomatoes, 1/4 cup reserved tomato juice, clam juice, bay leaf, and sausage. Place a piece of aluminum foil directly on rice. Bring to a boil, cover pan, transfer to oven and bake for about 18 to 20 minutes, or until the rice is almost tender and most of the liquid is absorbed.

5. Meanwhile, remove the shrimp from the refrigerator; peel and clean, discarding the shells. Remove pan from oven, uncover and remove aluminum foil. Gently stir in the peeled shrimp. Lay the foil back down over the surface of the rice and cover with lid, return to oven, and cook until the rice is tender, all the liquid is absorbed and the shrimp is cooked through, about 5 minutes.

6. Remove pan from oven, uncover, remove foil and bay leaf. Sprinkle with chopped parsley. Divide between bowls. Serve.

A DESSERT STAPLE TO CAP OFF YOUR NEXT DINNER PARTY

Dessert may be served last, but it still comes first in the hearts of many devoted foodies. Home cooks have many options to choose from when picking a dessert for a homemade meal, but sticking with a staple might be the way to go when serving lots of hungry dessert lovers.

This recipe from Lines+Angles can satisfy a crowd and ensure your next dinner party ends on a delightful and decadent note.

Cheesecake with Fresh Maine Blueberries. Makes 12 servings

For Cheese Filling:

2	lbs. cream cheese, room temperature	2	cups sour cream
1 1/2	cups granulated sugar	3 1/2	tablespoons milk
1/4	cup unbleached all-purpose flour	2	teaspoons pure vanilla extract
5	large fresh eggs	2	tablespoons fresh lemon zest

For Blueberry Topping and Glaze:

3 1/4	cups fresh Maine Blueberries	1	teaspoon water
3	tablespoons apricot preserves		Granulated sugar, for sprinkling

For the cheese filling:

1. In a large bowl, combine cream cheese and sugar, using an electric mixer, until well blended. Beat in flour. Add eggs, one at a time, beating each one until well combined. Beat in sour cream, milk, vanilla, and lemon zest, mixing until smooth. Pour cheese filling over crust.

2. Bake cheesecake until center is just set and top is slightly puffed, about 1 hour. Turn off oven, keep oven door closed and let cheesecake stand in oven for 1 hour. Transfer cake to cooling rack, let cool completely. Cover, refrigerate to cool further at least 8 hours or overnight before serving.



For the blueberry topping and glaze:

1. Rinse blueberries and pat dry.

2. Put apricot preserves and water in a small saucepan. Cook over medium heat until preserves have completely melted. Strain to remove any fruit pieces or lumps. Let cool slightly.

3. Arrange blueberries on top of cheesecake. Gently brush the blueberries with the apricot glaze. Sprinkle with granulated sugar. Remove sides from springform pan. Serve.

For Graham Cracker Crust:

2 1/3	cups graham cracker crumbs
1/2	cup unsalted butter; melted
1/4	cup sugar

Preheat oven to 375 F. Butter the bottom of a 9-inch springform pan. Combine crust ingredients in a food processor and pulse until crumbs are just moist. Press crumb mixture firmly onto the bottom and up the sides of prepared pan. Bake until crust begins to turn golden, about 8 minutes. Remove from oven and transfer pan to a wire rack to cool. Maintain oven temperature.

HOW TO BUY A HOME YOU CAN AFFORD

Riding the ups and downs of the financial market is challenging, particularly as it pertains to figuring out the right time to buy a home. After years of volatility, recent data indicates that the housing market might have hit an affordability ceiling, creating a much-needed period of rebalancing.



Although prices remain high, the bidding wars and back-office tactics that may have dominated past years have cooled considerably. This means buyers may have a wider window in which to purchase a home that is more affordable, states Cotality, a data analytic service. Those looking to buy now can explore options to ensure their next home does not bust their budget.

Know the numbers. The first step to buying a home is understanding the median home price. According to data from Realtor.com and Redfin, the national median home price has stabilized at \$429,156 in the United States. At the same time, mortgage rates have eased. CREA Statistics says the national average home price in Canada was \$663,828 in March 2026. The average 30-year fixed rate is now around 6.0 to 6.3 percent as of April 2026. For the first time since 2022, the typical mortgage payment has fallen below the 30 percent affordability threshold. Rocket Mortgage says this is a standard guideline suggesting households spend no more than 30 percent of their gross monthly income on housing expenses.

Sit down with a lender. By working with a lender to run numbers, potential buyers can get a clear picture of what they can afford. Plus, a mortgage preapproval may be a necessity when putting in an offer on a property. Lenders often lean heavily on the 28/36 rule to determine risk. This means that total monthly housing costs (principal, interest, taxes, and insurance) should not exceed 28 percent of a person's gross monthly income, advises PNC Bank. Total debt payments, including that new mortgage, car loans, and student debt, should remain under 36 percent.

Account for hidden costs. Buyers may be inspired to widen their search criteria to find an affordable home. That could translate into choosing an older home or one that requires more repairs and upgrades. It's important that a budget include maintenance reserves for annual repairs, as well as construction costs for immediate needs.

Look for undervalued areas. Many areas of the country have featured recent corrections in the housing market, making housing more affordable. Corrections have occurred in parts of Florida, San Francisco, and Los Angeles, among other locales. Buyers can target these areas and consider widening their search radius, especially if they work remotely and need not worry about commuting.

Target "old" listings. Buyers can have a real estate agent sort listings by how many days homes have been on the market. According to Mortgage Research, homes sitting on the market for more than 60 days are prime candidates for price cuts. Those homeowners also may be more inclined to negotiate.

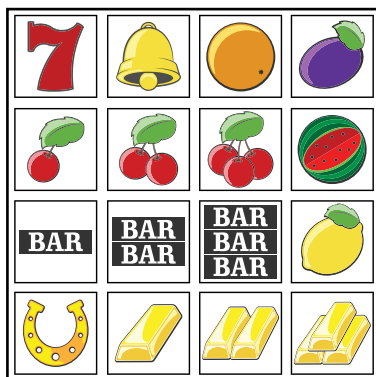

100 YEARS AGO THIS MONTH

HISTORICAL EVENTS: JUNE 1926

The month of June has been home to many historical events over the years. Here's a look at some that helped to shape the world in June 1926.

- Ignacy Moscicki is elected as the President of Poland on June 1. Moscicki's election to the ceremonial position comes after General Józef Pilsudski, who led a coup d'état to overthrow the previous government, declines to become president.
- Underwater construction of the Holland Tunnel is halted on June 1. The work stalls due to the sinking of the PS Washington Irving while the ship was being towed to Jersey City, New Jersey. The ship initially experienced trouble after it was struck by another ship in the North River during a fog.
- Norma Jeane Mortenson is born in Los Angeles on June 1. Mortenson would grow up and gain worldwide recognition and fame as an actress and model using the stage name "Marilyn Monroe."
- A spectator at San Francisco's Ewing Field accidentally drops a lit cigarette on June 5. The cigarette sparks a fire that burns down the wooden structure and soon spreads to adjacent buildings, ultimately destroying or damaging 40 buildings and houses.
- The Forrest River massacre of indigenous Australians begins on June 6. The massacre is started by policemen who were carrying out a punitive expedition against indigenous Australians after the killing of a white Australian.
- Babe Ruth hits a homerun that sportswriters at the June 8 game at Navin Field in Detroit estimate traveled 600 feet. That distance has never been confirmed.
- The "June Tenth Movement" begins in Korea on June 10. The movement is a student protest against Japanese colonial rule.
- Brazil announces its withdrawal from the League of Nations on June 14. Costa Rica had previously withdrawn in 1924.
- Italian Fascist leader Aurelio Padovani, who had fallen out of favor with Prime Minister Benito Mussolini, is killed when a fourth floor balcony at his home collapses on June 16. Padovani had stepped outside to greet admirers on the street below when the balcony collapsed, killing him and eight others.
- The Seventh Street Bridge opens in Pittsburgh on June 17. The bridge is renamed to honor Pittsburgh native and acclaimed artist Andy Warhol in 2005.
- On June 19, DeFord Bailey becomes the first African American to be listed in newspaper radio schedules as a performer on "WSM Barn Dance," which is later renamed "The Grand Ole Opry."
- New York Giants catcher Jimmy Boyle makes his major league debut on June 20. Boyle plays just one inning, the ninth inning of an 8-0 loss to the Pittsburgh Pirates, in what would be the only major league appearance of his career.
- Tens of thousands of spectators at Chicago's Soldier Field on June 21 watch a performance by the world's largest children's choir, composed of 60,000 children from more than 300 Roman Catholic parochial schools across the city.
- The Scholastic Aptitude Test, now known as the SAT, is administered to college and university applicants for the first time on June 23. More than 8,000 students at more than 300 testing centers sit for the exam.
- The "Sanjuanada," a plot to overthrow the Prime Minister and dictator of Spain, is foiled on June 23, one day before it was to take place.
- Amateur golfer Bobby Jones wins the British Open on June 25. Jones's victory marks the first time a non-professional had won the event.
- Melvin James Kaminsky is born in the Brownsville section of Brooklyn on June 28. Kaminsky grows up to become a beloved comedian, using the stage name "Mel Brooks."
