DID YOU KNOW? NUTRITION

Nutritional needs change as a person goes through different stages in life. For example, older adults typically do not need to eat as much as a younger person. According to Dr. Sarah Booth, director and senior scientist at the Jean Mayer USDA Nutrition Research Center on Aging at Tufts University in Boston, when people age, they need fewer calories to maintain the same weight. Also, multiple changes occur with age, and those shifts affect how a body digests and uses the food a person eats. According to federal dietary guidelines, women 60 and older require between 1,600 and 2,200 calories per day. Men in this age group require 2,000 to 2,600 calories per day. Calories should come primarily from nutrient-dense foods, with an emphasis on vegetables, fruits, whole grains, lean meats, and low-fat dairy. Older adults need to make every calorie count, and they may need to work with a nutritionist to get the foods they need to stay healthy.

FACTS ABOUT THE AUTUMNAL EQUINOX

Crisp autumn air will soon be rolling in and the leaves on trees will be trading their vivid green hues for shades of orange, red and purple. Fall begins on the autumnal equinox. Although people may see it as the official kickoff to bonfires and flannels, that’s not the only interesting part of this remarkable day.

• **It’s a moment and not a day.**

Despite what many people think, the autumnal equinox is not an entire day. In fact, the equinox is a precise astronomical event. It occurs at the exact moment the sun crosses the celestial equator, an imaginary line in the sky directly above the Earth’s equator.

• **It’s not “equal night.”**

Although the word equinox comes from the Latin word “aequus” (equal) and “nox” (night), we do not get exactly 12 hours of daylight and 12 hours of darkness on the equinox. This is because of how the Earth’s atmosphere refracts sunlight. The sun appears above the horizon even after it has technically set, according to the National Weather Service.

• **Northern lights can be seen.**

Those hoping to catch a glimpse of the aurora borealis will find the weeks surrounding the autumnal equinox are the prime window to do so, according to NASA. Geomagnetic storms that trigger these stunning light displays occur twice as frequently around the fall and spring equinoxes compared to the summer and winter solstices.

• **It’s not always on the same day.**

The autumnal equinox does not fall on the same day each year. It usually lands on September 22 or 23, but it can occasionally occur on September 21 or 24 (in the northern hemisphere), indicates the U.S. Naval Observatory.

The autumnal equinox is a unique and often enjoyable day on the calendar.

TIPS TO WINTERIZE A HOME AS COLD WEATHER APPROACHES

It's not uncommon to spend a lot of time out of the house when the weather outside is warm. The popularity of outdoor living spaces has made it easier than ever to enjoy nature without leaving home, which can generally be done from late spring to mid-fall each year in many regions. But as fall creeps toward winter and temperatures drop, it's time to head back indoors. As millions prepare to go back inside with winter approaching, it can be beneficial to winterize a home so interior spaces are more comfortable and exterior spaces are better able to withstand potentially harsh winter weather.

- Check your carbon monoxide detectors.** Fall is a great season to open the windows in many regions that feature prototypical autumn air. But the crisp air of fall will eventually give way to much colder air, at which time the windows will be closed and likely remain shut for months to come. The Minnesota Department of Health notes that carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas that cannot be detected by the senses. When windows remain closed for long periods of time, such as in winter, the buildup of CO, which can come from sources like water heaters, gas stoves, fireplaces, and clothes dryers, can poison residents over time. CO detectors are a safety net against such a fate, but they must be operating at peak capacity in order to be effective. As fall winds down, check all CO detectors to make sure they're working properly and replace any that are not.
- Check for drafts.** Check around windows and doors throughout the home to see if there are any gaps that are allowing air from outside to enter the home. If daytime temperatures are mild well into the fall, then it can be difficult to see if there are any drafts before the sun goes down. Conduct this check in the evenings when temperatures are a little more chilly and leaks are easier to detect. If drafts are detected, apply weather stripping around doors and windows that do not need replacement. If there's drafts around aging windows and doors, consider replacing them.
- Call a chimney sweeping service.** Cozying up beside a fire can make anyone forget the cold weather outside. But fireplaces should be subjected to a thorough cleaning by a skilled professional before each winter. Animals might have nested in the chimney since the fireplace was last used, and you will want any nests cleared prior to lighting your first fire of the season. In addition, the tar-like substance creosote, which forms when wood is burned in a fireplace, can build up and harden over time. That's a dangerous prospect, as creosote is highly flammable, which can lead to chimney fires. Creosote also can block the flow of air through a chimney, and that can trap gasses, including CO, in a home.
- Reverse your fans.** It's a simple step but one people may not even realize they can make. In homes with ceiling fans, residents can reverse the fans so the blades spin clockwise. This simple step pushes trapped warm air hovering around the ceiling into the living space below. This can make home interiors warmer without requiring residents to turn up the thermostat and increase their energy bill.
- Replace your HVAC air filter.** Replacing the air filter on your HVAC prior to winter can make the unit operate more efficiently, which can help reduce your wintertime energy bill. Replacing the filter prior to winter also improves indoor air quality, which is a notable benefit during a time of year when the windows typically remain closed for months.

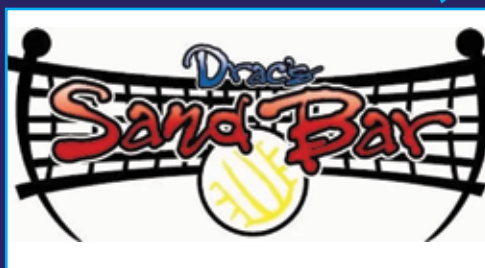

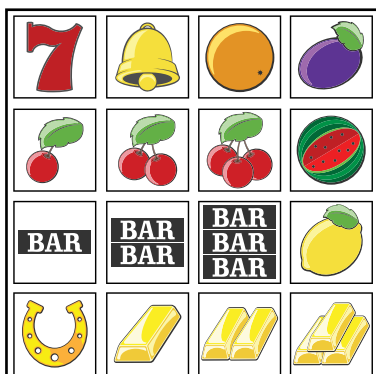

RECIPES: RICE SALAD, CHICKEN CURRY

RICE IS AT HOME IN SALADS, TOO

Rice is enjoyed in just about every corner of the globe. Rice can be a healthy component of a person's diet and it is especially beneficial for people who cannot enjoy other grains due to dietary intolerances. While many people might think of rice as a side dish to meat or fish, rice is the star of the show in this recipe from Line+Angles.

Southwestern Rice Salad With Black Beans. Makes 4 servings

For the salad:

- 1 cup white long-grain rice, rinsed
- 3/4 cup canned sweet corn, drained
- 1 3/4 cups canned black beans, drained
- 2 cups grape tomatoes, rinsed and halved
- 4 green onions, rinsed, trimmed and sliced
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper

For the dressing:

- 1 lime, juiced
- 4 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 red chili pepper, trimmed, seeded and finely diced
- 1 small handful fresh cilantro, chopped

To serve:

- 1 lime, sliced into wedges

1. For the salad: In a medium saucepan, bring 2 cups of lightly salted water to a boil; add rice.
2. Reduce heat to low, cover with a lid and cook for 15 to 20 minutes, or until water is absorbed and rice is tender to the bite. Remove from the heat and let cool, still covered, to one side.
3. Once the rice has cooled, rinse the sweet corn and black beans in cold water; drain thoroughly.
4. Fluff the rice with a fork before combining with the sweetcorn, black beans, tomatoes, and chopped green onions in a large serving bowl.
5. For the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together lime juice, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper until salt has dissolved.
6. Whisk in olive oil in a slow, steady stream until incorporated. Stir in the diced chili pepper and chopped cilantro.
7. To serve: Drizzle dressing over the salad and gently toss. Serve with lime wedges on the side for squeezing over.

WARM CURRY FLAVORS SPICE UP CHICKEN

Few foods are as versatile and as beloved as chicken. Chicken is a lean protein source that many people rely on for meals throughout the day. However, they may be stuck with the same tried and true recipes that can dull the taste buds over time. The good news is that there are no shortage of ways to prepare chicken, which will take on the unique flavor profile of the other spices and ingredients included. Fans of Asian cuisine can try this Lines+Angles recipe which offers the warm flavors of curry, ginger and coconut milk for an inviting meal.

Chicken Curry with Peas and Peppers. Makes 4 Servings

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- Kosher salt, to taste
- 16 ounces skinless, boneless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 cloves of garlic, diced
- 1 teaspoon fresh ginger, minced
- 1 cups chicken stock
- 1 2/3 cups unsweetened coconut milk
- 2 tablespoons curry powder
- Kosher salt, to taste
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1 red bell pepper, sliced
- 2 tablespoons fresh cilantro, rough chopped
- Cooked rice for serving

1. Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil over medium heat in a large saucepan. Season chicken with salt and saute until golden brown, about 5 minutes.
2. Remove the browned chicken and set it aside. Coat the pan with the remaining 1 tablespoon of olive oil and reduce the heat to low. Add the cumin, onion, garlic, and ginger; saute for 3 minutes or until onions are soft. Add chicken stock; cook until reduced.
3. Return the pan to medium heat, add the coconut milk to the saucepan, then whisk in the curry powder and season with salt. Let the curry simmer and thicken for 3 minutes.
4. Stir in the chicken, peas and red peppers; bring the saucepan to a boil. Reduce heat to medium low and let simmer for 5 minutes.
5. Garnish with cilantro and serve with rice.



RECIPES: SWEET POTATOES, SPANISH COOKIES



HONEY CAN SWEETEN ANY DISH

Honey has been enjoyed for centuries. Ancient peoples ate honey, and historians believe humans have been harvesting wild honey since the Stone Age. Honey has been widely consumed, used in medicinal salves and even left in Egyptian tombs for the afterlife. Due to its high acidity and low moisture, honey never spoils. The flavor of honey is entirely determined by the types of floral nectar bees gather, which can make cooking with honey interesting, as no dish may taste the same if different types of honey are used. Honey can be consumed straight from the honeycomb, or used as an ingredient in many recipes. For those who prefer the latter, this recipe from Lines + Angles is sure to please.

Honey-Glazed Sweet Potatoes and Squash With Chili and Halloumi. Makes 4 servings

- 1 small butternut squash, peeled, seeded and cut into wedges
- 2 large sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into wedges
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 2 red chili peppers, sliced
- 1/2 pound halloumi, cubed
- 1/4 cup pumpkin seeds
- 2 tablespoons sesame seeds
- 2 tablespoons basil pesto
- Kosher salt, to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper, to taste

1. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Toss the squash and sweet potatoes with plenty of salt and pepper to taste in a large roasting pan.
2. Cover with foil and roast for 30 minutes. Discard the foil and pour out any liquid in the pan.
3. Stir in the olive oil, honey, chili peppers, halloumi, pumpkin seeds, and sesame seeds.
4. Roast uncovered until the halloumi and vegetables are golden, tossing once or twice, about 25 to 35 minutes.
5. Remove from the oven and transfer to a serving plate. Spoon over the pesto before serving.

TRADITIONAL SPANISH COOKIES ARE A TREAT

Millions of people can trace their heritage to Spain or another Spanish-speaking country. The customs unique to Hispanic countries contribute to the rich tapestry of many local neighborhoods, and food is one of the easiest ways people share their heritage with others. Recipes may be passed down through generations and serve as a way to bring people together. Polvorones are a traditionally baked, crumbly Spanish shortbread made with a few ingredients. While they are especially popular during the holiday season, these cookies also can be enjoyed at other times of the year, including during National Hispanic Heritage Month between September and October. Try this recipe courtesy of Lines+Angles.



Polvorones With Chocolate Glaze and Sesame Seeds. Makes about 28 cookies

For the cookies:

- 1/3 cup ground pecans
- 2/3 cup confectioner's sugar
- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, cold and cubed
- 1/2 cup lard, cold and cubed
- 1 large egg

For the glaze:

- 1/4 cup cocoa powder
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1 tablespoon light corn syrup
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3/4 cup confectioner's sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

To decorate:

- 2 tablespoons sesame seeds

1. **For cookies:** Preheat oven to 350F. Line two big baking sheets with parchment paper.
2. In a mixing bowl, mix together the pecans and sugar until combined. Set aside.
3. Combine the flour and salt in a separate mixing bowl. Add the butter and lard and work the fats into the flour to a coarse, crumbly dough.
4. Add the pecan and sugar mixture to the dough and work it in with your hands. Add the egg and combine everything together, thoroughly, until it comes together as a ball of dough.
5. Roll pieces of the dough into 1-inch balls using floured hands.
6. Place on the baking sheets, well-spaced apart; flatten slightly with your fingers.
7. Bake until light golden brown, 12 to 15 minutes. Let cool on the baking sheets for 10 minutes before transferring to cooling racks to finish cooling.
8. **For glaze:** Combine cocoa, water, corn syrup, and butter in a saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture thickens, 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from the heat.
9. Gradually stir in the sugar and vanilla, beating until smooth.
10. Drizzle the glaze over the polvorones and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Leave to set.

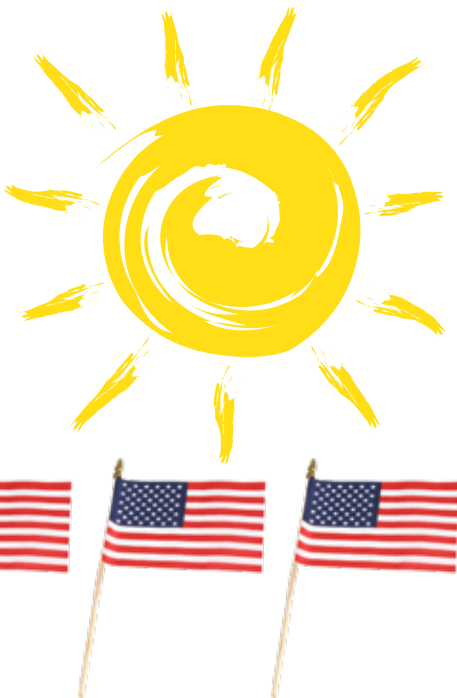

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HISTORICAL EVENTS: SEPTEMBER 1926

The month of September has been home to many historical events over the years. Here's a look at some that helped to shape the world in September 1926.

- One hundred people lose their lives in Spain on September 1 due to flooding from storms. The storms come after a 55-day drought.
- The funeral train of actor Rudolph Valentino arrives in Chicago on September 3 after departing New York a day earlier. Despite a heavy police presence, several grieving fans break through a police cordon and run onto the tracks.
- Fifteen members of the League of Nations Council unanimously accept a resolution to admit Germany to the League on September 4. A condition of that acceptance was Germany's pledge that the country would never again go to war.
- Five prisoners are shot and killed in Raymondville, Texas, by a group of Willacy County officers on September 7. The five prisoners were being held on suspicion of killing two Willacy County peace officers on September 5.
- Pope Pius XI publicly condemns the Action française movement on September 8. The far-right, monarchist and national political movement in France objected to the legacy of the French Revolution.
- Roughly 1,000 Greek rebels attack government troops in Athens on September 9. Many of the troops are loyal to deposed Greek dictator Theodoros Pangalos, but their revolt is quickly put down.
- Twenty-six-year-old Italian anarchist Gino Lucetti throws a bomb at the limousine of Benito Mussolini on September 11. Mussolini is unhurt, but eight others are injured and Lucetti is quickly captured and imprisoned.
- The Aloha Tower opens in Honolulu, Hawaii on September 11. The tower ultimately welcomes hundreds of thousands of immigrants to Honolulu and draws comparisons to the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor.
- The formation of the National Broadcasting Company (NBC) is announced on September 13.
- Argentina enacts law No. 11,357 on September 14. The law provides more legal protection for married women and expands civil rights for women.
- English writer Rudyard Kipling publishes his Debits and Credits collection on September 15. The collection includes the poem, "The Vineyard," which is interpreted as a criticism of the United States for its late entry into World War I.
- Los Angeles County District Attorney Asa Keyes orders the arrest of five individuals on September 16. Among those to be arrested is evangelist Aimee Semple McPherson, who is accused of conspiracy to corrupt public morals.
- A Category 4 hurricane strikes Miami and much of southern Florida on September 18. The hurricane causes an estimated \$100 million in damage and ultimately kills more than 370 people.
- Gangster Al Capone escapes harm when The North Side Gang conducts a failed assassination attempt on him in Cicero, Illinois, on September 20. The failed attempt is made in broad daylight while Capone is eating at his headquarters.
- Two men die during a failed takeoff as French aviator René Fonck attempts to conduct the first non-stop transatlantic flight on September 21. Fonck attempted to take off from Long Island's Roosevelt Field but he and his co-pilot were forced to leap to safety when the landing gear of his plane collapsed under the weight of the four passengers while the plane traveled on the runway.
- American inventor Thomas Edison declares radio broadcasting to be a commercial failure on September 22.
- A crowd of more than 132,000 people watch challenger Gene Tunney defeat heavyweight boxing champion Jack Dempsey on September 23 at the Sesquicentennial Stadium in Philadelphia. Dempsey was fighting his first bout in more than three years.
- John Coltrane is born in Hamlet, North Carolina, on September 23. Coltrane would become one of the most influential figures in 20th century music before succumbing to cancer in 1967.
- Henry Ford introduces the eight-hour workday and five-day workweek at the Ford Motor Company on September 25.
- American burglars Ray Terrill and Elmer H. Inman escape from prison in Oklahoma on September 27. The men would ultimately form the Kimes-Terrill Gang alongside gangster Matthew Kimes.
- The controversial play The Captive opens on Broadway on September 29. The play is among the first Broadway plays to address the subject of lesbianism and is shut down after 160 performances.



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
